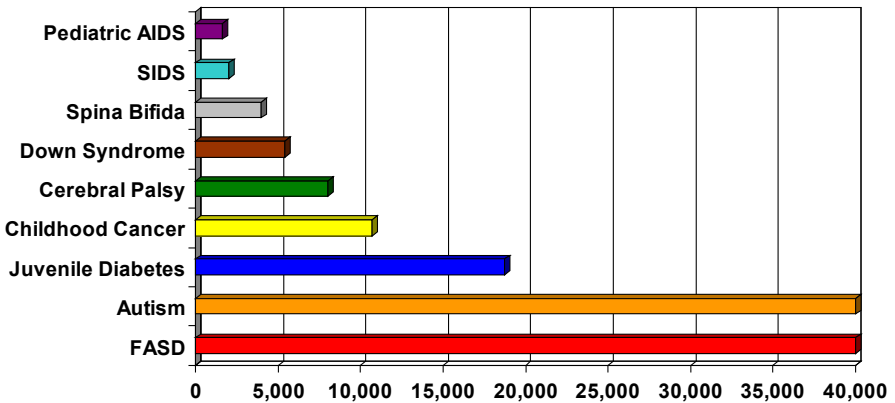


# NOFAS AND FASD

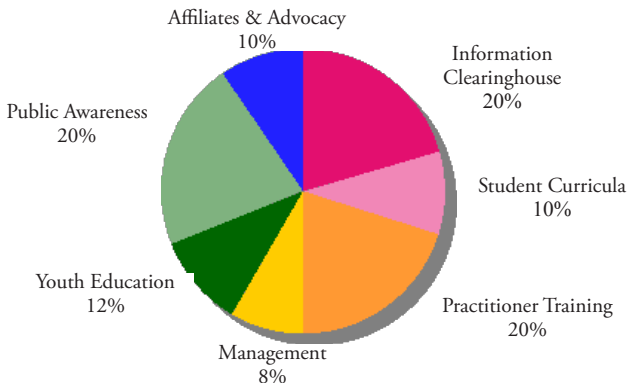
NOFAS is a non-profit public health advocacy organization striving for a nation where all children are born alcohol free. NOFAS prevents alcohol use during pregnancy and **Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD)** through primary prevention, education and advocacy. FASD describes the range of effects that can occur in an individual whose mother drank alcohol during pregnancy. These effects may include physical, mental, behavioral, or learning disabilities with possible lifelong implications.

**FASD is the nation's leading known preventable cause of intellectual disabilities and birth defects.**

# HONORARY HOST



**Senator Lisa Murkowski (R-AK)** is the first Alaskan-born Senator to serve the State, and only the 33rd female ever elected to the United States Senate. Prior to joining the U.S. Senate, Murkowski was elected to three terms in the Alaska State House of Representatives.

She is the senior Republican member of the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee and also serves on the Senate Appropriations Committee. Senator Murkowski is a member of the

Senate Health, Education, Labor and Pensions Committee – the first Alaskan to serve on that panel – and also is a member of the Senate Indian Affairs Committee.

Senator Murkowski has served as an original sponsor of multiple FASD-related bills and resolutions including S.3154 in the 111th Congress. She maintains an ongoing dialogue with families and professionals in the FASD field in order to understand how best to address the issue in Alaska and across the country. The Senator was presented with the NOFAS Leadership Award in 2004 for her commitment to FASD families.



## HONORARY HOSTS

**Senator Tom Daschle and Linda Daschle** have hosted the annual NOFAS Leadership Awards Benefit every year since 1993. They served as founding members of NOFAS in 1990, and remain among the country's leading advocates for Fetal Alcohol Syndrome prevention and services. Today, the Daschles serve on the NOFAS Advisory Board.



Senator Daschle is a Senior Policy Advisor in DLA Piper's Government Affairs practice and serves as a member of DLA Piper's Global Board. In 1978, he was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives and served until 1986 when he was elected to the U.S. Senate from South Dakota. He became Senate Minority Leader in 1994 and Majority Leader in 2001. He is the second longest serving Democratic Leader in history. Linda Hall Daschle is the president of LHD & Associates in Washington, DC. In her quarter-century career, she rose to become the second woman ever to be deputy administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration and the first woman to serve as FAA acting administrator.



# HONORARY HOST



## **Representative Patrick J.**

**Kennedy (D-RI)** is serving his eighth term in Congress as the representative from the First District of Rhode Island. He was elected to the Rhode Island House of Representatives in 1988 at the age of 21, and then re-elected in 1990 and 1992. Kennedy was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1994 and appointed to the House Appropriations Committee in December 1998. As part of his Appropriations duties, Kennedy sits on the Subcommittees on Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education; Commerce, Justice, Science, and Related Agencies; and on Military Construction and Veterans Affairs. He is also a member of the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform. He also served a two-year term as the chairman of the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee.

While fulfilling his civic duties, Kennedy has made healthcare one of his top priorities. He collaborated with his father Senator Edward Kennedy to successfully enact mental health parity legislation ensuring equality in mental health and substance abuse treatment services. He is a member of the Congressional Caucus on FASD and chairs the Addiction, Prevention and Recovery Caucus among many other advocacy positions, and has been a long time supporter of FASD prevention and services. He plans to retire from public office at the end of the current term.

## HONOREES



**Senator Tom Harkin (D-IA)** is serving his fifth term in the United States Senate. Senator Harkin's signature legislative achievement -- The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)-- has become known as the "Emancipation Proclamation for people with disabilities." As chairman of the Senate panel that funds medical research, he led the effort to double funding for research into cardiovascular disease, cancer, Alzheimer's and other diseases. In September 2009,

following the death of Senator Ted Kennedy, Tom became chairman of the Senate Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (HELP) Committee. Tom believes that to serve in this capacity is to carry on the legacy of Senator Kennedy, who dedicated his life to ensuring that our economy works for all Americans, guaranteeing every child the opportunity to pursue a quality education.

In 2005, Senator Harkin supported an initiative to address FASD in Community Health Centers that has been implemented in over 100 CHCs and Healthy Start in 15 states.

**Michael Ybarra, MD** was born in San Diego, California and attended Stanford University prior to receiving his medical degree from Georgetown University School of Medicine. He worked at the National Organization on Fetal Alcohol Syndrome in 2005 as a Public Health and Government Affairs Associate. Since 2006, he has been involved in the teaching and curricular development of the NO-FAS sponsored courses on FASD at Georgetown and Northwestern Universities. He has a number of publications and abstracts on public health issues including alcohol risk reduction strategies and maternal/fetal health. Dr. Ybarra is currently the chief resident at the Georgetown University/Washington Hospital Center Emergency Medicine Residency Program, the recipient of the "String of Pearls" teaching award from the medical students at Georgetown University, and was recently named "Resident of the Year" by the American Academy of Emergency Medicine.

## SPECIAL GUEST

### **Yvette Roubideaux, M.D., M.P.H.,**

a member of the Rosebud Sioux Tribe, South Dakota, is the Director of the Indian Health Service (IHS). Dr. Roubideaux previously worked for IHS for three years as a clinical director and medical officer at the San Carlos Service Unit on the San Carlos Apache Indian reservation in Arizona, and she worked for one year as a medical officer at the Hu Hu Kam Memorial Indian Hospital on the Gila River Indian reservation in Arizona. She recently served as assistant professor of family and community medicine at the University of Arizona College of Medicine.



Dr. Roubideaux received her medical degree from Harvard Medical School in 1989 and completed a residency program in primary care internal medicine at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston in 1992. She completed her Master of Public Health degree at the Harvard School of Public Health in 1997. She also completed the Commonwealth Fund/Harvard University Fellowship in Minority Health Policy before transitioning to a career in academic medicine and public health.


